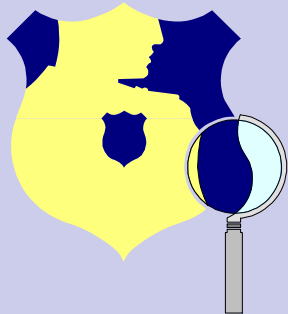

Community Outreach Programs

Youth Programs

D.A.R.E. – (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) is offered to all elementary schools in Eagan. A uniformed Police officer meets with 5th grade students weekly for 17 weeks to help students develop life skills to prevent drug/alcohol abuse and violence.

Police Explorer Program - The program is designed for youth ages 14-21, and offers an opportunity to explore the career of Law Enforcement through hands-on training and community involvement. The Explorer post is organized through a partnership with the Boy Scouts of America and is available to youth residing in Eagan.

Safety Camp – The Police Department, Fire Department and Eagan Parks and Recreation offer a 3-day mini camp for youth ages 8 and 9. The camp provides safety lessons on various topics including, fire safety, firearms safety, electrical safety, and bike safety. The camp is offered during the summer and registration is available through the City of Eagan, Parks and Recreation Department.

Youth Firearms Safety- Eagan Police Officers teach a 6-week Department of Natural Resources firearms curriculum to youth ages 12 and up. The curriculum focuses on safe weapons handling techniques, wildlife conservation and hunting rules and regulations. Students who complete the course are issued a Firearms Safety Certificate from the Department of Natural

Adult Programs

Citizens Academy – The program is designed to offer citizens insight into modern day policing through hands-on training conducted by Eagan Police Officers. The academy meets weekly for 7 weeks and includes information on department history, typical police response to calls for service, community policing programs, investigations, use of force, laws of arrest, narcotics investigation, and police K-9 units. Citizen Academy participants must be over the age of 18, pass a criminal background check and reside or work in the City of Eagan.

Senior Safety Camp- The program is designed to provide senior citizens with insight into the police department, community resources and crime prevention education. Seniors are presented information on various topics including, fraud, fire safety, nutrition, personal safety and fall prevention. The camp is conducted in two 4 hour session and registration is available through the Eagan Park and Recreation Department.

Chaplains Corps – The Police Department has partnered with the Faith Community in Eagan to form a Chaplains Corp. Voluntary members of the clergy representing different denominations provide support to the police department and the community in times of need.

Crime Prevention Programs

Business Watch – The police department provides training for businesses on various crime prevention topics including robbery prevention, shoplifting, premise security,

check and credit card forgery and other business related topics.

Crime Free Multi-Housing Program - The police department partners with apartment complex managers to maintain a crime free rental environment. An officer is assigned to specifically work with managers to address and resolve tenant problems. The department also provides managers with on-going training on crime prevention and current rental housing issues.

National Night Out – Since 1998 the Eagan Police Department, Fire department and Streets Department has participated in the National Night Out celebration. Neighborhoods that register with the Police Department receive a visit from one of the three city departments. The celebration is designed to unite neighborhoods, create awareness about crime prevention and forge police/community relations.

Neighborhood Watch – Neighborhood Watch is a program designed to empower neighborhoods to create a crime free environment through education and communication with the Police Department. The Police Department provides education for meetings on numerous crime prevention topics and can tailor programs to meet the neighborhood's needs. Security Premise Surveys – The department provides free security premise surveys to properties within the City of Eagan. Premise surveys are an interior and exterior inspection of a business or residence by an officer. The officer provides feedback on how to improve the physical security of the building.
